The Week in Review

The 7^{th} grade boys were treated to a special trip to Brooklyn this week in honor of completing the גמרא מכות אלו הן הגולין או פרק. They searched and scavenged around the huge store, hunting for clues (and for some nosh to take home) as their creativity and originality were being put to the test. The Pre 1A boys have been working diligently this year learning letters and their phonemes or sounds. So far we have learned 8 letters including three vowels (o, a and i) and their short vowel sounds. The students have even started blending sounds together to make words! The love of learning is evident, even during snack time, as the children manipulate pretzels, apples, Cheerios or whatever they can get their hands on to make letters and words! At the end of each day we have centertime, where our child centered learning activities are done. One of our most sought after centers is our iPad center, where the students have an opportunity to review math and language arts skills.



The 6th graders earned the privilege of creating a "word-cloud" poster for their classroom. The process was multi-stepped and co-operative: Each girl designed her own poster under Mrs. Komet's direction, and then they voted on the product that they would be proud to display. The inkblot won the day and is now hanging proudly in front of the classroom of the Class of 2018!

Mrs. Backenroth's interactive workshop was an eye-opener for many of the girls, as they were prompted to assess their values. Miss Chevi Garfinkel's talk further clarified that "hard" does not equate "bad" and that which we 'give up" as observant Jews truly uplifts and enhances our lives. All in all, it was a meaningful experience for the girls, with relevant take-away messages.

How many states and capitals can you name in 30 seconds? The 4^{th} grade girls aim to answer, FIFTY! This week the girls began to work towards this goal by learning the first group of states on the west coast. They have been filling in maps, quizzing each other on the spelling, and of course, singing the states' song until their throats are dry. At this rate, the girls will be geography experts in no time. If you hear strains of 'Olympia, Washington..." floating around in the hallways of YST, you can be sure that there is a 4th grader not too far away who is hurriedly progressing toward the coveted position of State and Capital Whiz.
