Parsha Points

ויצא הראשוו אדמני כולו כאדרת שער ויקראו שמו עשו

"And the first one came out ruddy all over like a hairy mantle, and they called his name Eisav."

Rashi explains that the name Eisav is derived from the root word עשה (made). Consequently, the name Eisav was given to him because of his appearance. He was completely formed and matured. We may suggest that the Torah is not merely concerned with describing Eisav's extraordinary physical appearance, but rather in teaching a fundamental spiritual message, as well. Eisav exemplified a unique type of evil, evil disguised as good. The Midrash compares him to a large vessel, externally bejeweled with diamonds, while internally consisting of earthenware. He cared only for the superficial, viewing himself as complete as long as he appeared perfect externally. He was not concerned with his inner self-development. He had no desire for change, for he felt he wasn't lacking anything. In describing Eisav, this pasuk alludes to the following thought. In order to be able to accept lessons and admonishment from others, one must always feel that he can engage in spiritual advancement. It is only through an awareness of our shortcomings that we can work towards achieving perfection.

Week in Review

Mazel tov to Rabbi Kramer's 4th grade class on their siyum of *Parshas Shemos*! The boys are working hard to master the 30 *shoroshim* they have learned in the *parsha*. They can't wait to start *Parshas Vayira* and the *makkos*. The boys have finished an intensive review of their Rashi skills and are getting really good at catching all of Rebbi's "mistakes" on their review sheets. The sounds of a *shofar* can be heard from the classroom as we learn *perek gimel* in *Mishnayos Rosh Hashana*. May we soon hear the sound of the shofar we are all waiting for!

The boys are having fun in lab these past few weeks. Some of the highlights of the activities/experiments include a journey in the digestive system for 3rd and 4th graders. They experienced the route food takes from the mouth through the small intestine. Making chyme was a blast – who knew gastric juices could be so entertaining?

The 6th graders were busy creating bionic hands a few weeks ago and then last week conducting some fun experiments with air pressure.

1st grade made volcanoes, color changing chameleons, and are working on making colors disappear. Meanwhile, the 2nd grade is working on an animal unit. They created animals with backbones out of pasta and are now working on animal life cycles.

8th grade is working on experiments pertaining to Newton's laws, and 7th grade practiced building tall buildings out of spaghetti, topped with a marshmallow.

6th grade scientists have been studying viruses and bacteria. We are currently using the scientific method to design and run experiments that test the effectiveness of different hand washing methods to kill bacteria. Using petri dishes, we will be growing bacteria left on our hand after washing and then analyzing and charting our data to determine how we can improve our hand washing to help stop the spread of bacteria.

Mrs. Greene's 7th grade girls are learning to read with deeper understanding by searching for various text features, or "signposts," along the way. In Langston Hughes' short story, "Thank You, Ma'am", the girls noted when they found the signpost Contrasts and Contradictions - when a character says or does something that is the opposite if what one would expect. They then wondered and discussed in small groups and as a class, "Why might he or she be doing this?" The class is now on alert for another signpost, "Aha Moments", when a character realizes, understands or finally figures something out, while reading "For Richer or Poorer" by Dorothy Parker. The students are asked to consider how such a moment might change things in the story.
