

Parsha Points

"ויהי משה בהר ארבעים יום וארבעים לילה"



It is obviously beyond the ability of even the greatest contemporary man to memorize all of the details of the Torah in forty days, simultaneously comprehending all of its great depth. Moshe did all of this while he also learned how to observe the *mitzvos*, including the specifics of the construction of the *Mishkan* and its accessories, which are not written in the Torah. Consequently, we may deduce that the process of study which transpired on the mountain was nothing less than a miraculous event. The question thus arises: Why were the forty days an integral part of this learning process? This great wisdom could have been miraculously imparted to Moshe in a single moment. We may derive from here that Moshe's effort was required. Forty days of extreme mental intensity were mandated. Only after this unique endeavor, however, was he rewarded with miraculous success. The ordeal of total mental concentration for forty days and nights, complimented by divine assistance resulted in Moshe's ability to comprehend the complete Torah. This procedure was specifically intended to serve as a paradigm for the process of future successful Torah study. Effort is always required, no matter how unique the talents of the individual.
