Parsha Points

“הירא את דבר ד' מעבדי פרעה הניס את עבדיו ואת מקנהו אל הבתים”

“Whoever among the servants of Pharaoh feared the word of Hashem, chased his servants and livestock into the houses.”

The G-d fearing Egyptians had the common sense to take their animals inside. Does this indicate *yiraa Shomayim*, fear of Heaven? This is the 7th plague to have struck Egypt. Moshe Rabbeinu's track record had been perfect. Whenever he foretold about a plague, it arrived in time and with intensity. Only a fool would leave his animals outdoors. In the *Zer Zahav* by *Horav Avraham, z"l, m'Teshchinov*, the author distinguishes the G-d fearing Egyptian who, upon hearing of the upcoming plague, immediately took action and brought his animals inside, from his counterpart, who waited until the hail came pounding down, wreaking havoc, before he gathered in his livestock. *Horav Yitzchak Zilberstein, shlita*, derives from here that a *yarei Shomayim* is not to come in contact with anything that might lead him to sin. This may be compared to a person who fears fire. He will make sure not to have anything of a flammable nature in his possession. It goes without saying that he will not put his hands in the fire. Week in Review

On Monday, January 1st, the 6th, 7th, and 8th grade classrooms hosted many guests. Fathers of our middle school boys were invited to experience a few hours in *yeshiva*. The day started with a most impressive *Shacharis minyan* at 7:30, run by our 8th graders. Then, everyone headed to the “YST Grand Ballroom” for a lavish breakfast. Afterwards, the parents proceeded to their child's classroom for learning. The rebbeim gave a quick rundown of the “*sugya*” and then the fathers and sons learned *בחברותא*. The *קול תורה* of more than 100 people learning permeated throughout and was truly a sight to see. May parents continuously shep much nachas from their children.

The boys in Pre-1A have been busy mastering the alphabet. They have learned 10 letters so far, including three vowels (o, a and i) and their short vowel sounds. If you visited their classroom this week you may have seen the boys sneakily slithering on the floor like snakes and curving their bodies to form our letter of the week, S. The students look forward to center time at the end of each day. These child-directed learning activities reinforce concepts while promoting independent, higher level thinking. We recently launched our iPad center, where the students have an opportunity to review math and language arts skills using various interactive apps.

One of the hallmarks of Mrs. Rabinowitz's first grade curriculum is the flexibility that is built into it. A recent class discussion about the five senses led to a conversation about bats and dolphins. The students' fascination with echolocation is spearheading their upcoming unit of discovery about these two mammals. They will study the bottlenose dolphin and the fruit bat to learn about their habitats, food sources, life cycles and how they socialize and communicate. Their course of study will culminate with a “compare and contrast” activity of bats and dolphins to demonstrate a mastery of their new-found knowledge. They can't wait to get started!

Preschool Jottings

When our kindergarten children are learning the letter *כ*, the most fun and engaging activity is to find Kosher symbols on food packages. And so, Morah Mimi and Morah Irene took their class to Stop 'n Shop to pretend shop for foods that are Kosher. The number of foods that they spotted with symbols was too big to count! Morah Rochel and Morah Faige organized a Kosher Grocery Store in their classroom. The children stocked the shelves (with food they brought from their wholesalers), decided the price of each item and proudly displayed the Kosher symbols.

It was triangles and squares in the nursery class these past two weeks. The children made triangle mats that they placed carefully atop their sailboats. On a fishing expedition, the children noticed that the body of the fish is a triangle and the tail, as well. They were so excited to fish for fish, but much more excited to fish for triangles! A house is a square structure and the children were so busy filling the square with furniture, people and household items.

The Farmer came back to school last week with lots of vegetables and some fruits. We lined them all up in size order. Then we discussed what color the outside of the vegetable is and what color the inside is. The children were fascinated by the purple skin of an eggplant that covered the white flesh, the brown skin of a kiwi that shells the green fruit and the dark green skin of an avocado that covers the green flesh. The farmer gave them each toothpicks and grapes and showed them how to make a structure. Wow! The children could not believe what they could make with just these two items! This week we had a shoe party. Everyone brought in one shoe, we sized them up and talked about who wears each shoe. We had high heels, snow boots, slippers, sneakers, baby shoes, Zaidy's shoes and crocs on display.

In the girls' school... Mazel Tov to Morah Rubinfeld's ה' כתה upon the completion of פּרשׂת וּאֵרָא! What an accomplishment! The girls have worked hard translating פּטרוּקִים, decoding מְרֻשָּׁי, and becoming proficient note-takers. They celebrated with a well-deserved סיוּם that was a delightful experience. Most important of all are all the life lessons they gained which will hopefully remain with them throughout. The beautiful תפילה in the class was brought to a new level with the addition of שמע קריאת to their davening, May the girls always value each and every תפילה and may all their נתקבל be תפילות.

Mrs. Epstein's 4th grade students have been hard at work with their multiplication facts. This week was spent with much practice on getting their multiplication tables straight and moving on to more complex word problems and two digit numbers. With continued practice, the students will soon be pros at multiplication and before they know it they'll be tackling division too! Keep up the great work and don't forget to keep practicing those tables!!

In 7th grade science, the girls have completed their fascinating unit on Heredity. The students discovered a lot about the unique traits they have and the genes which control them. They now know all about where their genes come from and how they can have "hidden" genes which do not express themselves. Stay tuned to hear all about our next, exciting topic coming up.....
