The דובנא מגיד explains through a משל how much children have to strengthen themselves in תפלה, and pour out their hearts before Hashem during the ימים נוראים.

There was once a man traveling with his young son. Whenever they would come upon a difficult place to travel, such as a river, mountain, or valley, the father would bend down, lift up his son and place him upon his shoulders, and carry him safely through. Late one evening, they arrived at a fortified city with towering walls. The only entrance to the city had been securely latched for the night. The father was frightened; listening to the howling winds, he reminded himself of reports of bandits that prowled around outside the city walls. There were wild merciless bands who would rob their victims and show no mercy. Looking up, the father noticed a small window; not large enough for an average man, but a small child might be able to slip through if he tried. The father turned to his son and said, "My child, until now I've cared for you and protected and carried you; at this point I need your help. The only way to gain entrance into the city is through that small window. If you climb up and squeeze through the window and climb down the inside of the wall and unlatch the city gates, we can still be saved."

Generally, all of a child's needs are provided by his parents. However, Rosh Hashana - a time when we all come before Hashem with תפלה parents could have their children fill their needs. As the גמרא says, without the בית המקדש, it is difficult for a person's תפילות to reach up to Hashem. But the of young children are very, very powerful, as they are considered to be without אפילות. If you, children strengthen yourselves in תפילום and Daven from the depths of your hearts, Hashem will accept your pho to open up the gates of חסד for all of us and שנילות us with a good, sweet year.

#### Week in Review



On Thursday afternoon, the boys of grades 6 - 8 had the unique opportunity of participating in the dedication of their Beis Medrash, newly named ארון נחום l'iluy nishmas R' Nochim Zeldes, z"l. The boys gathered, as usual for mincha, and were joined by Mr. Stern, members of the Va'ad Hachinuch, and members of the greater Zeldes and Brudny families, to participate in this meaningful event. Rabbi Herskowitz spoke of the special qualities of a *makom tefila*,

and introduced Rabbi Tzvi Rotberg, editor of the Mishnas R' Aharon, who told the boys that he was gratified to participate because he had promised Rabbi Zeldes, z"l, to share a poignant story of mesirus nefesh for Torah that he had first-hand evidence of. One day, Rabbi Zeldes came to the publication offices of Mishnas R' Aharon, where Rabbi Rotberg was working on something that appeared to be target practice. Upon closer inspection, the sheets of target practice were filled in with Divrei Torah. Rabbi Rotberg told the boys that he had received the manuscript from the son of the author, who spent the war years in Siberia. There was a severe shortage of paper and the only way that the mechaber was able to compose his Torah thoughts was to walk 15 km in the freezing cold of Siberia to an army training camp, where he would scavenge through the garbage bins for used target practice sheets of paper. R' Nochim, z"l, was so moved by this display of *mesirus nefesh*, that he asked Rabbi Rotberg to share it with others. Sure enough, Rabbi Rotberg brought photocopies of the original writings as tangible evidence of this incredible devotion and distributed the copies to each of the participants. Rabbi Brudny ended the program by appealing to the boys, who enjoy the beauty of the Beis Medrash Chazon Nochim on a daily basis, to enter its wall with the joyous knowledge of the privilege of t'fila.
