## Parsha Points

"... with happiness and a glad heart when you had an abundance of everything."

"...ושמחת ובוטב לבב מרב כל..."

*Meirot Kol*, "when you had an abundance of everything" refers not only to a richness of material goods, but rather to a bountifulness of spiritual wealth. It brings to mind the words of Ben Zoma (Brachos 58a) who marveled, "Consider how hard Adam HaRishon had to work to obtain a piece of bread. He had to plow, sow, harvest, make sheaves, thresh, winnow, sift, grind, knead, bake and only then could eat bread. Yet I get up in the morning and I find all this prepared for me on my table. In the same way, we must reflect on Hashem's grace in granting us spiritual advancement. We must pause to think about the immense intellectual exertion Avraham Avinu had to expend until he reached the recognition of the existence and oneness of Hashem, of the divine providence and of the immortality of the soul. The Avos and our forefathers in Egypt further developed the understanding of these fundamental ideas until they were worthy to receive the Torah and the 613 mitzvos. It is through these spiritual lights that we can attain a unification with the absolute divine truth. Our ancestors labored hard to reach these values and truths, yet we find all these abundant spiritual treasures readily placed before us. How grateful and joyous we should be for all the good Hashem has granted us.

In essence, that is the meaning of *besimchah uvetuv leivav meirot kol*, "the happiness and glad heart for the abundance of spiritual richness." *Meshech Chachmah Taken from Torah Treasures.*

## Week in Review

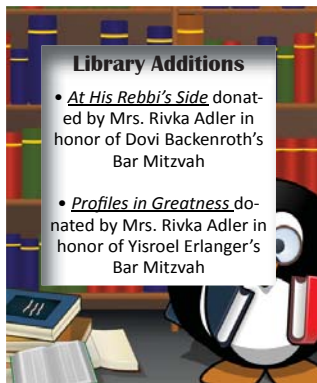
